The pandemic coordinator and team will be responsible for facilitating the local planning process, monitoring implementation of you local Health and Safety Plan, and continued monitoring of local health data to assess implications for school operations and potential adjustments to the Health and Safety Plan throughout the school year.

- ✓ The CVCA Purchasing Department will supply on ground schools with disinfecting wipes and sprays as well as alcohol-based hand sanitizers and medical mask.
- ✓ Staff shall be reminded that they are responsible for disinfecting assigned workspace (s) daily.
- ✓ All educational staff shall disinfect high touch surfaces in classrooms and common areas. To include but not limited to the following:
 - Doorknobs
 - Keyboards
 - Tabletops
 - o Light switches

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Adjustments have been made to janitorial contracts to include daily disinfecting of high touch surfaces in commonareas. High touch surfaces included, but are not limited to light switches, doorknobs, faucets, keyboards, copiers, desk, chairs, counter tops, and classrooms and offices ventilation vents.

CVCA will supply education buildings with disinfecting wipes and sprays as well as alcohol-based hand sanitizers and gloves. Staff shall be reminded that they are responsible for disinfecting assigned work - spaces daily.

Staff who suspect that a student has been exposed to or is infected with COVID-19 will contact the CVCA Nursing and Medical Department.

Students who are tested positive will be quarantined for ten days and provided medical treatment in and when needed.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

CVCA will post signs in highly visible locations, that promotes agency and CDC guidelines for stopping the spread of the Covid-19 virus.

CVCA Education department will utilize a scheduling format that allows for recommended social distancing guidelines. The scheduling format will utilize in person learning with virtual learning. The education department will also utilize alternating student days to meet social distancing guidelines.

Student educational materials will not be shared wherepossible. Educational materials that are shared will be anitized daily (computer, laptops, lab materials, gym equipment).
